[Bois Forte Heritage Center and Cultural Museum](#). The Bois Forte Heritage Center & Cultural Museum is located on the shores of Lake Vermilion and on the grounds of the Fortune Bay Casino (Tower, MN). The museum, owned and operated by the Bois Forte Band, is dedicated to telling the Bois Forte Ojibwe story, as our name, Atisokanigamig, or Legend House, implies.

[Fond du Lac Band Cultural Center and Museum](#). Located near Cloquet, Minnesota, this museum has artifacts, clothing, historical documents, photos, and more on display.

[Grand Portage National Monument Heritage Center](#). The Grand Portage National Monument Heritage Center opened on August 10, 2007 with a commitment to honor the area's history, people and culture. The Heritage Center is located on a rocky hill overlooking the reconstructed fur-trading post. It features pine pillars that rise from the basement to the roofs pointing out the Four Cardinal Directions important in Ojibwe culture. The building houses exhibit galleries about Ojibwe culture and the fur trade, a bookstore, multi-media programs, park offices, archives and a classroom.

[Mille Lacs Indian Museum & Trading Post](#). Explore the story of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe through museum exhibits, objects, demonstrations, and tours, and shop for locally made Native American arts and crafts in the restored 1930s trading post. Operated in cooperation with the Minnesota Historical Society.

[National Museum of the American Indian](#). A part of the Smithsonian, this museum in Washington, DC has extensive online exhibits and resources.
